In art we learnt about natural dyeing using plants and food scraps. Children were encouraged to smash, squish, roll, soak and steam the colour pigment from oxalis (sour grass), cineraria flowers, onion skins, avocado pips/skins and turmeric to create vibrant patterns and often unexpected colours.

The enthusiasm of students, teachers and parents made it a joy to teach at FCS!
